



Permaculture Seeds

Permaculture seeds connect us back to the earth for a variety of reasons. They provide food, windbreaks, control erosion, fertilize the soil, attract wildlife, clean the air, produce building materials and generally provide a diverse source of green products while beautifying and sustaining the planet.

Albion - our best ever bearing strawberry gives delicious fruit June to October.

Royal Red - purple raspberry. Cross between a red raspberry and blackberry. Huge firm sweet raspberry.

Banana Gold Raspberry - ever bearing taste like a sweet banana.

Black Raspberry - tasty exotic black fruit. No suckers...

Lorraine Apricot - northern hardy golden apricot. Tree has been grown on the farm for over twenty years...

Black Duke Cherry - small hardy tree produces big black sweet cherry.

Cherry Olive - shrub with beautiful foliage, bronze metallic bark and fragrant yellow flowers. Bright red cherries dry into a sweet cherry raisin. Versatile plant with drought tolerance grows in shade or sun, fixed nitrogen and makes a dense hedge or windbreak that wildlife and birds adore.

Black Mulberry - small, hardy beautiful tree that produces sweet, juicy black berries. Self fertile tree has no disease or insect problems.

Red Heart Plum - hardy northern plum tree that does not get black knot.

Manor chum - are a mix of cherry and plum, combining the best characteristics of both. Small hardy vigorous bush..

Bisex Kiwi - shade loving vines with great white flowers. Great for covering fences walls or trellis. We discovered that this plant will produce without a pollinator.

Cornellian Cherry - a beautiful explosion of colour in spring when the bare branches cover themselves with masses of bright yellow flowers. Large red cherries.

Montreal Bosc Pear - small russet skinned fruit with sweet crunchy flesh... stores for months...

Northern Pecan - hardy, pecans are happier in heavy soils. Valuable trees for their hardwood lumber.

Heartnut - trees grow fast, makes a beautiful food tree. Trees have nuts after five years vigorous, variable nuts.

Tamarind - produces a sweet edible pod similar to a honey locust. Tropical indoor plant. Easy to grow.

Hazelnuts (tall bush like tree) - small, multi-stemmed trees (3 m) have beautiful dense foliage ideal for windbreaks/hedges.
